Have you ever taken the time to gaze at the windows in the sanctuary and foyer, and ponder the names engraved upon them? When I first came to town, I

would look at them and wonder who these people were. But after a while I gave it up, for I never heard the names in conversations at church. I surmised they were Disciples and citizens in God's Kingdom from long ago, without a close relationship to us today at First Christian. I was right and wrong.

There is among us a history buff, who, the past few weeks, has been researching these ancestors in the faith and has discovered many were sons and daughters of the South who moved to Texas soon after the War Between the States; many of them were first generation Texans, born here late in the 19th century. These were people who helped settle our city and county; they were merchants and soldiers and farmers, two of them, ministers of this very congregation. They lived in homes still standing, on Main Street and Penelope, or near Killeen, or Cameron. And they are buried in area cemeteries.

So, yes, I was right, the people in the windows are from long ago, but I was wrong that they have not a close relation to us. We are their children in the faith, bearing the good news of Lord Jesus and carrying on the tradition of charity and service to our community, which they began more than 150 years ago. Thanks be to God for their witness and vision and faithfulness. And thanks be to God for the steadfast love he has always shown his servants here at First Church in Belton.



Recipe of the Month

Texas Cabbage Slaw

Ingredients:

large head of Chinese Cabbage
bunch green onions
pkg crushed chicken-flavored Top Ramen soup noodles
2/3 cup slivered almonds
1/2 cup sesame seeds

Directions:

Chop and mix cabbage, onions, and bell pepper. Refrigerate until ready to mix.

Brown crushed noodles, almonds, and sesame seeds in butter. Cool mixture in refrigerator until ready to use.

Sprinkle with dry chicken soup packets and stir all into noodle mix. Combine well with greens.

Dressing:

cup vegetable oil
2/3 cup sugar
1/3 cup rice wine vinegar
tsp each salt & pepper
Blend well and pour over slaw.
